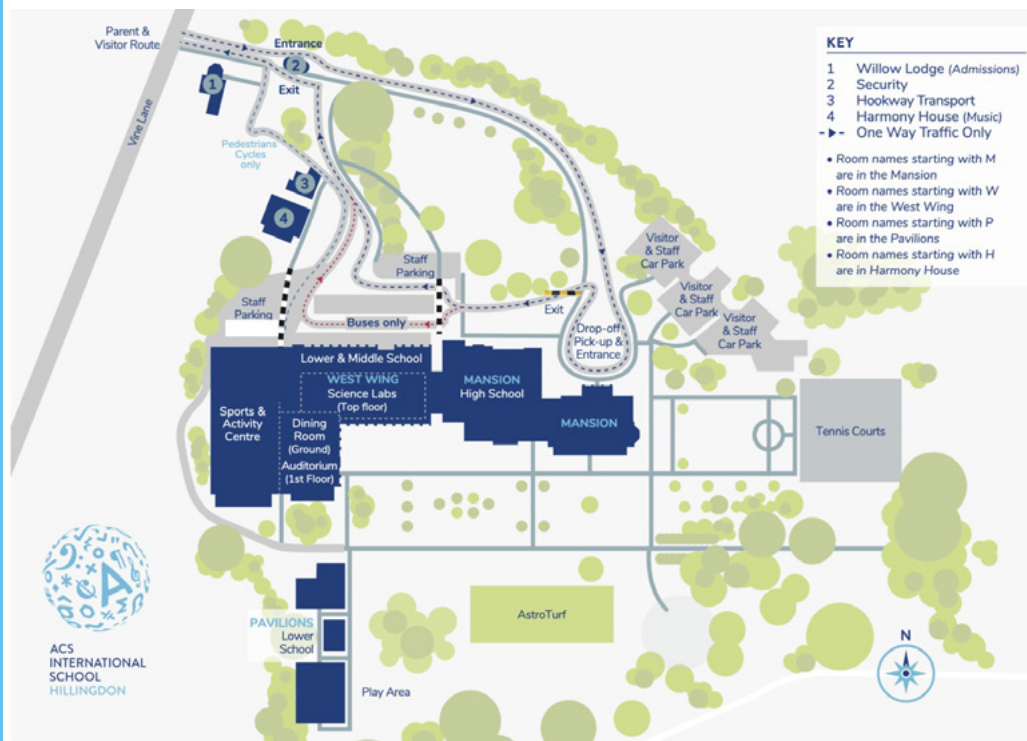

3 | FOR NEW ARRIVALS INTO THE UK & FIRST DAYS AT SCHOOL

What to do first . . . for living in the UK

1. Register with the NHS & your local GP (General Practitioner). Find your nearest NHS physicians at [Find a GP](#)
2. Open a UK bank account for salaries, bills etc.
3. Get a UK mobile phone number
4. Register for a National Insurance (NI) number if you do not already have one. You will need this for the right to work in the UK.
5. Find your closest hospital with an A&E (Accident & Emergency/Emergency Room) by entering your postcode at: [Find nearest emergency hospital](#)
6. Schedule appointments for telephone, internet, gas, electricity and water services, as well as getting a [TV license](#).
7. Purchase car insurance and get information about driving in the [UK Driving in GB with non-GB licence](#). For insurance there are comparison websites, such as: [Compare the Market](#) / [Confused](#) / [Go Compare](#) / [Money Saving Expert](#)

What to do first . . . for school

1. ACCESS THE ONLINE INFORMATION SYSTEM

Once you have enrolled and paid your fees, you will be provided with your login details for [PowerSchool](#) where you will have access to the forms that need to be completed prior to your child(ren)'s first day of school. A to-do list is provided on the Admissions Hub. On the [Admissions Hub](#), you will also have access to PSO key contacts and related information.

2. PURCHASE SCHOOL SUPPLIES

You will be given a list of school supplies for your child(ren).

3. PURCHASE P.E. (PHYSICAL EDUCATION) UNIFORM AND KIT

For students in Grades 5-10, P.E. uniforms are mandatory for class and can be [purchased here](#).

4. ACTIVATE PARENTPAY ACCOUNT

After your child is enrolled, you should receive a [ParentPay account](#) activation email from finance@acs-schools.com. Follow the instructions on the email to set up the account and add credit to your child's catering account. This is so your child(ren) can purchase food from the cafeteria. If you have any queries or do not receive your account activation email, please contact finance@acs-schools.com

Transport

WHAT TYPES OF BUS TRANSPORT ARE THERE?

ACS Hillingdon operates both a door-to-door and shuttle bus service, which picks up your child(ren) from either outside your house or a dedicated shuttle stop in the morning and drops them off again after leaving the school at 3:25pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, and 2:45pm on Wednesdays. The door-to-door service is available for all students from Pre-K upwards. There are also Shuttle Services, which pick up from various Pick-Up Points in the morning and drop off after school for students from Grade 1 and above.

DO YOU OFFER A LATE BUS?

We offer late buses to certain shuttle stops for students taking part in after-school activities to all students from Grade 1 upwards. This service can be booked via our new transport app Vectare. Our bus services are subject to availability and changes without prior notice.

HOW DOES PARENT DROP-OFF WORK?

The drop-off line is strictly designed to let children out of your car and move on. If you need time to organise yourself, you should park in the East Wing Visitors car park by the entrance to the school. Please park and drive responsibly onto our school campus.

WHERE ON CAMPUS CAN I PARK MY CAR?

Parents can park their cars in the East Wing visitors car park before 8.30am and in the turning circle outside the Mansion House/Reception between 8.30am and 2pm. All other times are prohibited due to busing hours.

Health and Safety/Security on Campus

WHAT ARE THE AFTER-SCHOOL RULES ON CAMPUS?

Students in Lower School and Grades 5-8 must be supervised after school. There are opportunities for students in these grades to stay after school for a supervised activity. For more information, please contact the divisional secretary.

CAN MY CHILD WATCH THEIR FRIENDS PLAY SPORTS?

Lower and Middle School students must be supervised if they are staying after school. Parents are welcome to attend the games and supervise their child(ren).

WHY IS THE PEDESTRIAN ENTRANCE ALWAYS OPEN?

The pedestrian entrance is located in front of the security gate and is monitored. Security is aware of all visitors and will ask pedestrians the purpose for their visit. Pedestrians who are not expected will not be permitted access to campus.

CAN STUDENTS LEAVE CAMPUS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY?

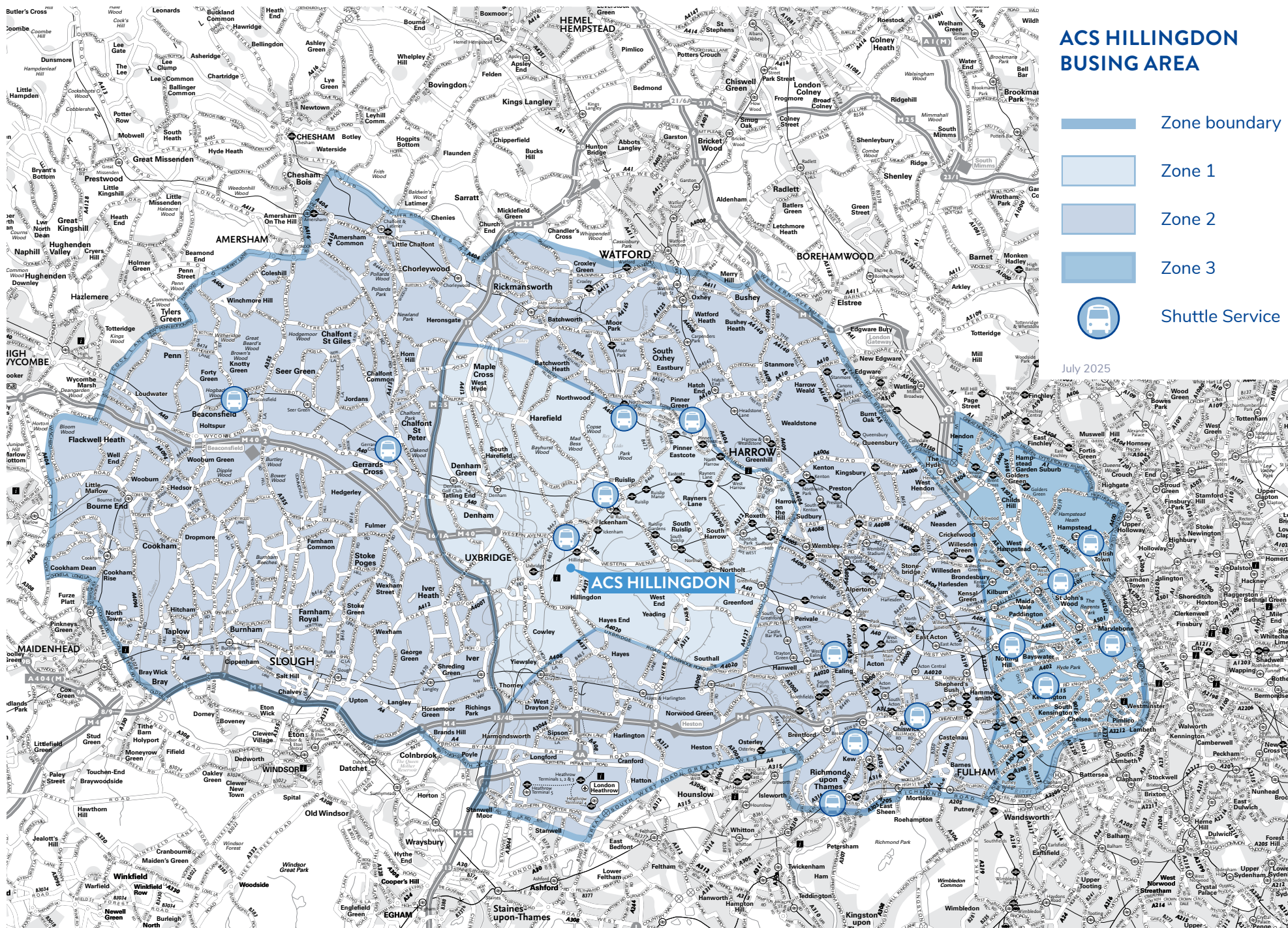
Students are not permitted to leave campus during the school day unless they are unwell, or their parent has informed the school that they have an appointment. Students leaving campus will be given two exit slips from their divisional office or the nurse. One of the exit slips must be retained by the student/parent and the other must be given to Security at the gate in order for the student to leave campus.

CAN I TAKE MY CHILDREN TO THE LOWER SCHOOL AND EARLY CHILDHOOD PLAYGROUNDS AFTER SCHOOL?

No this is not permitted.

WHERE IS THE NURSE?

Word	Explanation
Advisory	A regular meeting time where students receive academic guidance, social-emotional support, and build relationships with a designated teacher and peers.
Alumni	Students who have previously attended ACS Hillingdon.
Advanced Placement (AP)	US university-level courses taught in High School.
Assembly	Meetings for sharing information or presentations or awards, some of which parents may be invited to attend.
Bank Holiday	No school; banks, post offices and some local shops will be closed.
Buddy	Current ACS student who is paired with a new student to help them settle in at school.
Bulletin	At ACS Hillingdon, parents will receive every Friday a "Hawk News" bulletin from each division. It will keep you informed of ongoing and upcoming events related to Lower and Upper school.
BYOD	Bring your own device.
Cafeteria	Dining hall for students and staff.
Campus	All of the school's grounds.
Campus Calendar	The main calendar with all activities, events and meetings for the school year.
CAT4	Test used to measure students' reasoning skills to show learning potential.
CCA/ECA	Co-curricular/extracurricular activities.

Clubs	Students or Teachers led activities that would usually take place during lunch time or after school hours.
Creativity Activity Service (CAS)	As part of the IB Diploma, students must complete a programme of approximately 150 hours total over Grades 11 and 12 in sports, charity work, etc.
Chaperone	An adult (staff, parent) supervising field trips, parties, dances, etc.
Coffee morning	A casual get-together over coffee, tea, and light refreshments, for socialising with other parents.
College Workshop	High School informational meetings for parents and students regarding preparation for university.
Core Subjects/Classes	The academic subjects in each division, usually Maths, Language Arts, Social Studies, Language; different from 'Specials' or 'Extras'.
Counsellor	Trained members of staff primarily there to provide social and emotional support for students.
Credit	In High School, a unit that represents the successful completion of a course, used to measure progress toward graduation requirements.
Curriculum Coordinator	Directs the planning, delivery and ongoing improvement of curriculum, assessment and instructional practices within the school.
Division/Divisional	There are two divisions in the school: Lower School and Upper School. Each division has its own office.

Dress Code	ACS provides a standard dress code for students, however school divisions may have other requirements.
DofE	Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme.
DTL	Digital Teaching and Learning.
Early Childhood	A sub-division of Lower School for Grades Pre-K and K.
English as an Additional Language (EAL)	Extra English language support for students with limited English ability.
EE	Extended Essay (part of the IB Diploma Programme).
EPP	Elite Performance Pathway, a programme created for selected students to improve in their respective sports through tailored workouts and expert coaching.
Field Trip	Students travel to museums, theatre, etc. in the London area during the school day, usually by bus.
Freshman	A Grade 9 student.
GCD	Global Citizen Diploma.
Grade Representative	A parent who communicates information from PSO to other grade level parents. Also helps organise any grade level parties or other events.
Hawk	School mascot; the 'hawk' name and logo is used especially by sports teams.
Hawks Hub	A one stop shop platform once your children are enrolled at school, for any day to day questions you may have.

Head Hawks	A group of 4 Upper School students (2 Head and 2 deputy) who represent the student body, fostering school spirit and sense of community. They also act as a voice for their student body with school staff and senior faculty.
Head of School	The ACS Hillingdon staff member responsible for all school divisions.
High School	The division consisting of Grades 9-12.
Home Language Enrichment (HLE)	Lessons for students with a native language other than English.
Homeroom	Lower school students of the same grade meet daily under the supervision of their homeroom teacher, who takes attendance and administers other school business.
International Baccalaureate (IB)	A globally recognized educational programme that develops students' academic, personal, and international-mindedness skills through challenging, inquiry-based learning.
IBCP	A two-year programme for students aged 16–19 that combines career-focused learning with IB academic courses and core elements that develop personal and professional skills (Theatre and Digital Arts at ACS Hillingdon).
IBDP	A rigorous two-year pre-university course for students aged 16–19, focusing on academic excellence, critical thinking, and global understanding across six subject areas and core components (TOK, EE, CAS).
In-Service Day	No school for students; training sessions for staff.
IO	Individual Oral, a form of assessment used in Language courses in the IB Diploma programme.

ISAA	International School Athletics Association, made up of selected international schools for competitive sports tournaments.
ISI	Independent Schools Inspectorate which assesses the school every three years, most recently in 2025.
Junior	A Grade 11 student.
Junior Varsity (JV)	Upper School student sports teams, which comes under the Varsity Team.
K	Kindergarten, 5-6 year old students.
Learning Support	Individual/small group learning support provided for students needing extra help with literacy, maths or English language.
Liaison	PSO parent representative of a school division or parent group, such as Lower School Liaison or Australian Liaison. Acts as a 'link' between PSO board, parents and school.
Locker	Lower School students each have their own unlocked cupboard for personal belongings. Upper School students each have a locker for their bags and school materials.
Lower School	The division consisting of PreK-Grade 4.
LSSA	London School Sports Association, consisting of other London international schools for competitive sports competitions.
Mansion House	The main, original Grade II listed building housing the Head of School office, main reception, and iconic Red and Green Rooms.
MAP Testing	Measures of Academic Progress, an online assessment taken by all students twice a year in specified grades.

Medical Office (Nurse)	Medical office for all students on campus staffed by a nurse near the Lower School office.
National Honor Society (NHS)	An organisation that recognises high school students for their excellence in scholarship, leadership, service, and character.
Nurse	See 'Medical Office'.
OFSTED	The inspectorate for children and learners (Office for Standard in Education) in England; contributes to the provision of better education through inspections and regulations.
Open House	Informational evenings for parents held by each division (Lower School, Upper School) at the start of each school year.
Open Mornings	Mornings set aside for interested families and students to come learn more about ACS Hillingdon and tour the facilities.
Orientation Day	Important informational day held before school starts in August; class lists are posted, new students and families meet to tour school and gather other information.
Pre-K	Pre-Kindergarten, 4-5 year old students.
(4G) Pitch	The large grass playing field in the back of the school.
Prom	Formal High School dance, held in spring, usually for students in Grades 9-12.
Parent School Organisation (PSO)	Consists of all parents and staff at ACS Hillingdon. An annually elected board leads the PSO.
Parent Information Meeting	Regular gatherings to update parents and share information.

PSO Board	The elected leadership of the PSO who organise activities and events to support students, parents and staff as well as communicate with the school regarding parent ideas and concerns.
Recess	Free play time for students before/after lunch. May also mean school holiday break.
Report Card	School reports showing each student's progress.
Residential Trip	Residential trips are school trips that take place over a few days and pupils are required to stay away from home. Residential trips are usually activity-based trips.
SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test)	US test taken for university/college admissions by Grade 11 and 12 students; may be taken more than once.
Service Learning	Enables students at ACS Hillingdon to be caring contributors around the world, with the local community, and in school. Opportunities are presented as clubs, humanitarian expeditions, or other avenues.
School Colours	Blue and white.
Security Lodge	The small lodge at main school entrance with security staff.
Senior	A Grade 12 student.
Sophomore	A Grade 10 student.
SPC	Student Progress Conference.
Specials/Special area classes	Other than core subject classes; specialist teacher classes in art, music, computers, etc.

Staff Appreciation	A time set aside by the PSO to show appreciation for school staff. Can be one event or a week-long series of events.
Student Ambassadors	Current students who are selected to represent the school during Open Mornings or New Student Orientation. Ambassadors can also be asked to help new students during the school year in different ways.
Student Council	Students elected by their peers in Lower and Upper School to form a council that organises parties, dances and charity events. A teacher advises each council.
Student Services	Our department for Learning support and EAL.
TextMagic	In the event that weather (or anything else) may result in closure of the school at short notice, we will inform parents using our emergency messaging system – TextMagic.
Transitions	PSO parent volunteer team who helps ease the transitions of families who come and leave ACS Hillingdon.
Try-outs	Sports/Drama Scheduled right after school on designated days before seasonal sports teams begin or dramatic performance rehearsals. Students demonstrate their skills to earn a place on team/performance.
Varsity (V)	Our highest-level competing sports team.
West Wing	The addition to the original mansion house which consists of a vast majority of the classrooms.

Yearbook

End-of-year books produced by Lower School and Upper School with photos of all students and their activities during the school year. Each student has the option to purchase a book and are encouraged to have other students sign or write encouraging messages in their own.

- If your bank card is lost or stolen, block it, report it stolen and request a new card. Your new card will be posted to you, and can take 3-5 working days.

NHS WEBSITE

One of the first things to know is how healthcare works in the UK. The National Health Service (NHS) is the UK's publicly funded healthcare system, offering most services free at the point of use, including doctor visits, hospital treatment, and emergency care.

To access NHS services, you need to register with a General Practitioner (GP) near your home. GPs are your first point of contact for non-emergency health concerns. Once you have a home address, you can find and register with a GP through the NHS: [Find a GP](#). You will need to take proof of address and ID when registering with your GP.

For non-urgent medical help, dial 111 or visit [111 online](#). In emergencies, call 999 or go to the nearest hospital A&E (Accident & Emergency) department/Emergency Room [Find nearest A&E hospital](#)

You can learn more and access services at www.nhs.uk, including how to find dentists, order prescriptions, and check eligibility for free care.

PRIVATE HEALTHCARE

Private healthcare is also available and widely used by people who want faster access and more choice of specialists.

Private healthcare in the UK includes:

- Private hospitals and clinics offering consultations, diagnostics, and surgery
- Private health insurance, which can cover some or all of the costs
- Self-pay options, allowing you to pay directly for treatment without insurance

Many private providers offer fast appointments and access to top consultants. Some employers also include private health insurance as part of their benefits package. You may require a referral via your NHS GP to access private services using your insurance.

Private healthcare doesn't replace the NHS – it's a complement. You can use both depending on your needs and circumstances.

CHILDREN AND THE LAW

- **Driving**
Young drivers must be 17 years old. Make sure you have car insurance even for learner drivers.
- **Alcohol**
Please see the government guidance regarding alcohol consumption: [Alcohol and young people](#). It is against the law to drink alcohol under the age of 18. However, at age 16, your child, when accompanied by an adult, can buy or be bought beer, wine, or cider to drink with a meal, but only in a restaurant or pub with an eating area.

Setting Up A Home In The UK

FINDING A HOME

There is no multiple listing service in the UK as there is in some other countries, so when you are looking for a home to rent or buy, you will have to contact the local estate agents for availability and pricing. There are websites that list available properties from multiple estate agents:

Estate/letting agents work for the landlord or property owner. Propertymark are a professional body that ensures agents listed with them meet high standards. Check their website for listings of local estate agents for buying or renting property: [Find an estate agent](#).

PLUMBING AND HEATING

Landlords are responsible for making sure that gas fittings and flues are maintained in good order, and gas appliances that they own in their residential premises, and flues, are checked for safety every 12 months. They must also keep a record of the safety checks for at least two years and issue it to existing tenants and any new tenants before they move in. Be sure to have your boilers checked annually by a Gas Safe registered heating engineer. You can search for a registered engineer in your area: [Find or check a gas engineer](#).

Tipping/gratuity

Some guidelines are:

- **Restaurants:** It is customary to leave 10–15% for good service. Many places will add the gratuity automatically to the bill. Read the fine print in the menu or on your bill when you get it. (You are not required to pay this and can even ask that it be removed). You aren't expected to tip in a pub when you are ordering and paying for your drinks at the bar. If you get exceptional service from your barman you can leave the equivalent cost of a half pint.
- **Hairdressers:** Not required, but if you wish to, you can either add on a few pounds or opt for 10% of the services rendered.
- **Post Delivery Person, Rubbish Collector:** It is not the custom to tip even at Christmas time.
- **Taxi Drivers:** Typically 10% of the fare. If you happen to head over to France, a 15% tip is usually included in your bill at a restaurant. In Germany, The Netherlands, Belgium and Switzerland you can add 5% to your bill total, but rarely up to 10%.

Housing/Utilities

AREA COUNCILS

In the UK, the local District Council Office is equivalent to the Town Hall, and takes care of community services such as rubbish and recycling, building permission, parking permits and schools. The Council is a good source of information for local children's clubs and playgroups. You can find your local council by entering your postcode or street and town at:

COUNCIL TAX

Your local government levies council tax against your residence for public services. Even if you are renting from a private landlord, you are responsible for paying this tax. More information can be found here: [Council tax information](#)

ELECTRICITY

Voltage & Frequency: The UK uses a 230V, 50Hz electrical system, which is standard across Europe but may differ from other regions like North America (120V, 60Hz). Plug adapters are available for equipment with special 110/240 (dual-voltage) capabilities. An adapter DOES NOT change the voltage. Therefore, DO NOT use an adapter on any appliances with a motor without also using a transformer.

Plug Type: British power outlets use Type G plugs, which have three rectangular prongs; travelers will need appropriate adapters if coming from countries with different plug types.

Fused Plugs for Safety: All UK plugs are required to have built-in fuses (usually 3A or 13A) to protect appliances and wiring from electrical faults or overloads, adding an extra layer of safety compared to some other countries.

If you miss a flight because of illness, you will have to forfeit your entire holiday if you do not have travel insurance. It is often more competitive to buy an annual policy through your insurance company than to buy it through the holiday provider each time you travel.

Transport

DRIVING

- Familiarise yourself with the different types of traffic cameras. There are lots of cameras installed, violations are recorded on your licence and you may receive a fine. If you get too many points, you could lose your licence.

This includes speeding, parking violations, driving without having paid road tax etc.

- It is against the law to use your mobile phone whilst driving. It can result in penalty points and a fine. [Check Phone usage in car.](#)
- GPS/Navigation Systems are very helpful when driving in the UK. If your car doesn't come equipped with one, you may want to consider buying a portable device or a mobile phone app such as [Waze](#)
- London Congestion & ULEZ zones are active in London and could mean your vehicle is chargeable. You should check this on [both](#) websites before travelling.
- To drive your own car in the UK, you will need the following:

 - Automobile insurance – see insurance on previous page
 - [Vehicle registration](#)
 - MOT The purpose of the MOT is to ensure that your car complies with key roadworthiness and environmental requirements. Once a car is three years old, it must have an MOT every year. Many garages do MOT testing which takes about an hour; look for one with an MOT sign. See [MOT information](#)
 - Vehicle tax – all cars in the UK must have vehicle tax. See [Vehicle Tax.](#)
