SENIOR SCHOOL DIVISIONS

Middle School (Ages 10-14 / Grades 5-8)

Our Middle School students study all the core subjects you would expect to lay a well-rounded, solid foundation for further study, including mathematics, English, sciences, languages, social studies, physical education, PSHE, visual and performing arts, and digital skills.

Our ambition is for students to become problem solvers and critical thinkers; to persevere, act with integrity, and take risks in their learning; to be creative and active; and to care about their local, national, and international communities, taking action to make life better. Pastoral care is particularly important during the Middle School years; therefore, we provide a nurturing environment and a robust wellbeing programme to ensure students feel safe, supported and empowered. We aim to make these transitional years a journey of discovery that leads to confident and versatile young adults.

Upper School (Ages 14-16 / Grades 9 and 10)

Throughout Grades 9 and 10, our students choose from a wide selection of subjects that earn credits towards their ACS (US) High School Diploma. They also begin working closely with our University and College Counselling team to select their preferred pathway for Grades 11 and 12, including other

school-leaving qualifications. This academically rigorous preparation, with accelerated pathways and extension opportunities for advanced students, focuses on growth and development rather than preparing for national tests at UK Key Stage 4.

Students are also encouraged to take part in a diverse range of co-curricular activities, including drama, music and sport, and to join a variety of clubs such as Model United Nations and coding. Community engagement and leadership responsibilities play a vital role in providing a well-rounded student experience.

In both Middle and Upper School, we monitor progress through a combination of school-based and externally benchmarked assessments. We offer meaningful assessment that nurtures students' love of learning and prepares them for the next stages of learning.

High School (Ages 16-18 / Grades 11 and 12)

Our High School students benefit from rigorous academic qualifications which are highly regarded by world-renowned universities. Whichever pathway our students choose, they will benefit from the guidance of expert teaching staff, supported by university and personal counsellors who have an eye on their post-secondary ambitions.

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

The IBDP is an academically challenging programme that ensures students aged 16 to 18 are ready for success at university and beyond.

The programme is:

- Broad and flexible, requiring six subjects which can be configured to differentiate and maximise each student's strengths
- A programme that encourages university-level

- skills and the development of competencies beyond the classroom
- Resistant to grade inflation, making it a reliable benchmark of attainment
- A very popular entry qualification with UK, US, and other overseas universities, with many lowering entry requirements for IB students in recognition of its rigour
- More likely to get students into a Russell Group university, where they are more likely to earn a first-class degree.*

Course Requirements

- Subject Groups students take six subjects, three at Higher and three at Standard Level. They must take studies in language and literature, language acquisition, individuals and societies, science, maths, and an optional art or another from the first four categories.
- The Core contains three elements: Theory of Knowledge explores the foundations of

knowledge and introduces students to university-level thinking; the Extended Essay is 4,000 words of self-directed research; and Creativity, Action and Service requires fixed hours engaged in artistic, sporting and/or voluntary work.

COLLEGE BOARD ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAMME

Advanced Placement (AP) is an internationally recognised academic programme with a range of university-level courses across seven disciplines: Arts, English, Social Studies, Mathematics and Computer Science, Sciences, World Languages, and Interdisciplinary.

The programme is:

- Academically rigorous, offering challenging coursework that mirrors university-level classes, while helping students build essential time management and study skills
- Broad and flexible, offering a wide range of subjects with the average High School student taking 5 to 6 courses over Grades 11 and 12. Each course is one-year in duration
- Content-rich, laying strong foundations for future study across a range of disciplines and allowing students to specialise in subjects they enjoy
- Fast-paced and stimulating, with a level of depth and challenge comparable to A-levels and the IB, despite being shorter in duration

- Excellent preparation for university, fostering independence, critical thinking, and adaptability in dynamic academic environments
- Globally recognised, opening pathways to top universities in the US, Canada, the UK, and beyond.

At ACS Cobham, we proudly offer prestigious Advanced Placement (AP) awards that recognise exceptional student achievement. These include the **AP International Diploma**, awarded to students who excel across five or more AP exams, and the **AP Capstone Diploma**, which develops critical thinking, research, and collaboration through AP Seminar and AP Research courses. Students who complete just the Seminar and Research components receive the **AP Seminar** and **Research Certificate**. These awards reflect our commitment to providing rigorous, university-level academic opportunities that prepare students for global higher education success.

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Eligible ACS Cobham students graduate with an ACS (US) High School Diploma, accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). Whether they pursue the IB Diploma, AP courses, or a combination of both, all students also meet the requirements for the High School Diploma, ensuring strong preparation for higher education and beyond.

As a result, most graduates leave with multiple qualifications that strengthen their university applications. The accredited Diploma offers a rigorous, well-rounded academic experience and serves as a recognised entrance qualification for most North American universities and institutes around the world (often with additional requirements), supporting student success at university and beyond.

Sport

Located on a spacious 128-acre campus, ACS Cobham offers excellent sports facilities, including football and rugby fields, softball and baseball diamonds, a floodlit all-weather astroturf pitch, a 400m running track, and tennis courts. Swimming is available throughout Senior School, supported by a well-established swim school for all ages and our competitive Cougar swim team.

Our strong sports programme provides year-round opportunities in football, tennis, basketball, and swimming, alongside seasonal sports such as volleyball, rugby, baseball, softball, beach volleyball, golf, cross-country, dance, and track and field. Students regularly take part in local, national, and international competitions, showcasing the depth of our sporting culture. Facilities include The Arena, a competition-sized basketball and volleyball court, a 25-metre swimming pool, a dance studio, and a comprehensive fitness suite.

Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

We welcome students with Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND), providing support both in inclusive classrooms and specialist teaching environments to ensure equitable access to the curriculum. Personalised learning accommodations and tailored assessment arrangements help students progress academically while building their skills as lifelong learners. We serve students with mild to moderate learning needs across all grade levels, based on admission requirements and available spaces. However, we are unable to support students with severe behavioural, emotional, or learning difficulties.


English as an Additional Language (EAL)

We believe that achieving proficiency in academic English is not just about overcoming a challenge; it's about recognising and celebrating the advantages of being multilingual.

Our English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme supports students in developing the fluency and confidence they need to thrive in a global community and succeed in rigorous international academic programmes, including the US College Board Advanced Placement (AP) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

Focused, small-group lessons are designed to rapidly build foundational English skills, vocabulary, and grammatical accuracy. Depending on their level of English, students are initially assigned up to three lessons per day. These sessions are led by EAL specialist teachers and are based on subject content to ensure students remain connected to the wider curriculum as their language skills develop.

Admissions

We operate a rolling admissions process that enables students to join us in any grade and at any time of the academic year, subject to availability and acceptance.

Our online application process takes a holistic approach, assessing each candidate individually by reviewing previous school records, references, student questionnaire answers and standardised test scores. We also ask for additional information such as educational psychologist reports or English as an additional language (EAL) test, where relevant.

A refundable enrolment deposit is payable after a student has been accepted in order to reserve a place. For more details of the application process, please contact our Admissions team.

Bursaries


ACS schools is a registered charity with the mission of advancing education for all. As part of our philanthropic goals, we offer financially assisted programmes in the form of bursaries. These financial awards range from 10% to 100% of our full fees.

All bursaries are means-tested, with each award dependent on the student's individual circumstances. In line with our values, we look for students with enquiring minds, an international perspective and a strong desire to make a difference.

We offer Middle School bursaries for students aged 11 or 13 (Grades 6 or 8), and High School bursaries for students aged 16 (Grade 11). Students applying for the IBDP bursary should display the ability to benefit from an academically rigorous programme.

We welcome applications from parents who believe their child will benefit from our international curriculum and who will make a real contribution to life at ACS Cobham. We ask that candidate pupils are resident in the UK and have the right to remain (subject to complying with full immigration laws and regulations). Following an application, we assess the student information and financial data provided and reach a decision in March prior to the academic year of entry.

Catering

Our award-winning catering department is operated in-house, enabling us to employ and train all our own chefs. We take great pride in producing delicious, fresh and nutritious food that appeals to our international community.

Our menus, independently reviewed by registered dieticians, are always seasonal and follow the School Food Trust's nutritional guidelines. We source all our fresh ingredients from approved suppliers. Most of our daily deliveries of vegetables, fruit, dairy and meat come from local producers, so we can trace each meal from farm to fork.

Uniform

ACS students do not wear school uniforms. A school sports kit is available and required for physical education and school sporting activities.

Students are expected to dress respectfully and responsibly to maintain an appropriate learning environment.

Busing

ACS Cobham offers a comprehensive bus service with door-to-door and shuttle options, ensuring safe and efficient transportation for students. Our Transport Coordinator works to arrange busing from your child's first day (subject to availability). To help us organise this, please provide your home address as soon as possible.

Our door-to-door bus service is available from Pre-Kindergarten upwards, and the shuttle service and late bus service are available from Grade 1 onwards.

Shuttle service stops are assigned each year according to the home locations of our families. Example stops include Cobham, Claygate, Oxshott, Esher, East/West Horsley, Kingston, New Malden, Walton, West Byfleet, Weybridge, Woking, Putney Heath and Guildford (subject to change).
