OUR APPROACH TO LEARNING

Our expert teachers and educational leaders are deeply committed to the principles of the International Baccalaureate (IB), with its focus on academic excellence, inquiry and differentiated instruction, and rich co-curricular experiences. Our students become service-oriented, globally-minded world citizens with inquisitive minds and a real sense of personal responsibility.

The IB advantage

In addition to our Junior School offering the IB Primary Years Programme (IBMYP), we have worked hard to become the only school in England fully authorised to offer all IB programmes, including the:

- IB Middle Years Programme (IBMYP) ages 11 to 16
- IB Career-related Programme (IBCP) ages 16 to 18
- IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) ages 16 to 18

The IB Programmes are designed to enable students to join at any age – except the last year of the Diploma (17-18 year olds). However, the ethos, practices and study skills developed by the IB provide the most advantage the longer a student is in the system. It is this meticulously planned academic and emotional progression that enables IB students to out perform their peers in other curricula. It is an advantage that often leads IB students to attend some of the highest ranked universities in the UK and around the world.





READY TO QUESTION.

THE IB MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME, AGES 11–16

At the heart of our approach is a commitment to get our students ready for whatever comes next. We achieve this by balancing the opportunities we offer outside of the classroom with the renowned International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IBMYP).

Our students study all the core subjects you would expect from a leading school – maths, English, science, languages – plus a range of art and design options. We do not offer GCSEs or follow the national curriculum. Because of this, we see our students benefiting from sitting fewer exams, as we prefer them to achieve a deeper level of subject knowledge and understanding, beyond simply learning for a test.

The IBMYP is founded on three strong principles:

- Holistic learning
- Communication
- Intercultural awareness

And is underpinned by the IB Learner Profile, where students strive to be:

Students study subjects in eight distinct areas:

- Language and Literature (English)
- Language Acquisition (French or Spanish)
- Mathematics
- Sciences (incorporating all scientific disciplines)
- Individuals and Societies (incorporating History, Geography and Economics)

- Arts (Drama, Music and Visual Art)
- Design (Product Design and Digital Design)
- Physical and Health Education

In addition:

- All students participate in *Wellbeing* studies. Students aged 14 and 15 also complete a course of *Study Skills* each year
- *Service as Action* is an integral part of the programme and students complete an Advisory Service Project each year, as well as participating in service activities on an individual basis
- Students aged 15 also complete a *Personal Project* in their final year of the IBMYP. This in-depth and independent research project enables them to actively showcase the skills and knowledge they have developed throughout the programme

The IBMYP is designed to be the best preparation to meet the academic rigour of the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) and the IB Career-related Programme (IBCP).

Equivalent to GCSEs and iGCSEs

Importantly, our age 16 students are registered for IBMYP eAssessments. All eAssessment subjects are accepted by Ofqual, and are registered as Level 1 and Level 2 qualifications, making them equivalent to GCSEs and iGCSEs. Completion of the eAssessments will provide students with an official International Baccalaureate (IB) transcript as evidence of each student's level of achievement for university applications.

READY TO EXCEL.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES, AGES 16–18

Simply put, the IB Diploma (IBDP) is the best-established alternative to A Levels, and the world's most recognised age 16–18 programme. Unlike most national curriculums, the International Baccalaureate (IB) has a reputation for consistency and stability, free from unwanted government interference.

It is:

- Broad and flexible, requiring six subjects which can be configured to differentiate and maximise each student's strengths
- An academic programme that encourages university-level skills, and the development of skills outside of the classroom
- A reliable benchmark of attainment – grade inflation free
- A very popular entry qualification with UK, US, and other overseas universities, with many lowering entry requirements for IB students
- Known to offer students more options when applying to university
- More likely to get students into a Russell Group university, where they are more likely to earn a first-class degree*
- Very appealing to employers, who value its breadth
- Tailor-made for the world we now live in

IBDP and A Levels grading compared

The percentage of students achieving a Diploma each year has remained constant over the last decade which indicates that, unlike the A Levels, there has been little grade inflation.

- The highest possible score for the IB is 45 points – only 0.2% of students worldwide are able to achieve this each year
- According to the UCAS tariff, 45 points is the equivalent of five grade A* at A Levels, 40 points is the equivalent of four grade A*

at A Levels and 35 points is equivalent to two grade A* at A Levels, and one grade A

Course requirements in two parts:

- **Subject Groups** – students take six subjects, three at Higher, and three at Standard Level. They must take maths, science, studies in language and literature, language acquisition, individuals and societies, and an optional arts or another from the first five categories
- **The Core** – contains three elements: Theory of Knowledge explores the foundations of knowledge and introduces students to university-level thinking; the Extended Essay is 4,000-words of self-directed research; and Creativity, Action and Service requires a sustained commitment to artistic, sporting and/or voluntary work

The IBDP champions group work, discussions, presentations and developing skills required at university and employment.

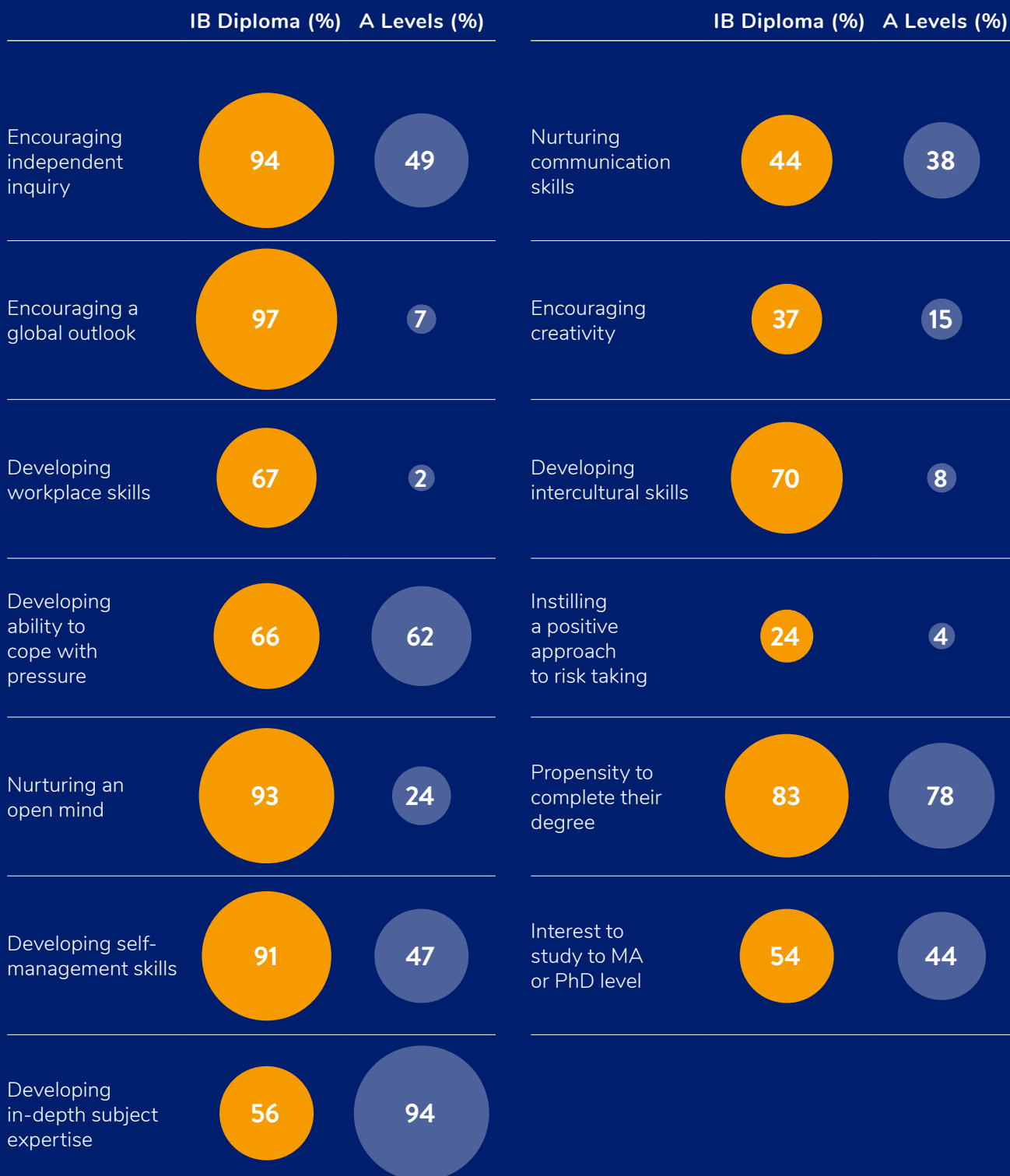
IB Career-related Programme (IBCP)

The IBCP incorporates the vision and educational principles of the IB into a stand-out programme specifically developed for students who want greater career-related learning.

- Importantly, the IBCP prepares students for an ever-changing world of work, asking them to consider new perspectives, engage in learning that makes a positive difference, develop both academic and practical skills, think creatively and critically, communicate effectively, work independently and in collaboration, and become self-confident, resilient, and flexible
- The programme's three-part framework comprises career-related work, the study of two IB Diploma courses, and the IBCP Core that connects the chosen IB Diploma courses directly with career-related studies

BURSARIES

ACS schools is a registered charity with the mission of advancing education for all. As part of our philanthropic goals we offer financially assisted programmes in the form of bursaries. Our bursary programme enables us to offer places to talented students who would benefit from our world-class education but whose family circumstances make it difficult to meet our usual fees.

These financial awards range from 10% to 100% of our full fees. All bursaries are means-tested, with each award dependent on the student's individual circumstances. In line with our values, we look for students with enquiring minds, an international perspective and a strong desire to make a difference.

We offer Middle School bursaries for students aged 11 or 13 (Grades 6 or 8), and High School bursaries, including the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP), for students aged 16 (Grade 11). Students applying for the IBDP bursary should display the ability to benefit from an academically rigorous programme.

Our criteria for awarding bursaries

We welcome applications from parents who believe their child will benefit from our

international curriculum and who will make a real contribution to life at ACS Egham. We ask that candidate pupils are resident in the UK and have the right to remain (subject to complying with full immigration laws and regulations). Following an application, we assess the student information and financial data provided and reach a decision in the March prior to the academic year of entry.

Calculating the bursary award

Bursaries are awarded for up to seven years and range from 10% to 100% of the full tuition fees. In exceptional circumstances, these awards can also include additional school-related expenditure so students can participate in every aspect of school life. We calculate the size of each bursary based on an assessment of family income and other financial assets, so we ask for appropriate documentation as part of each application. We review bursary awards on an annual basis to ensure they reflect any changes in families' financial circumstances.

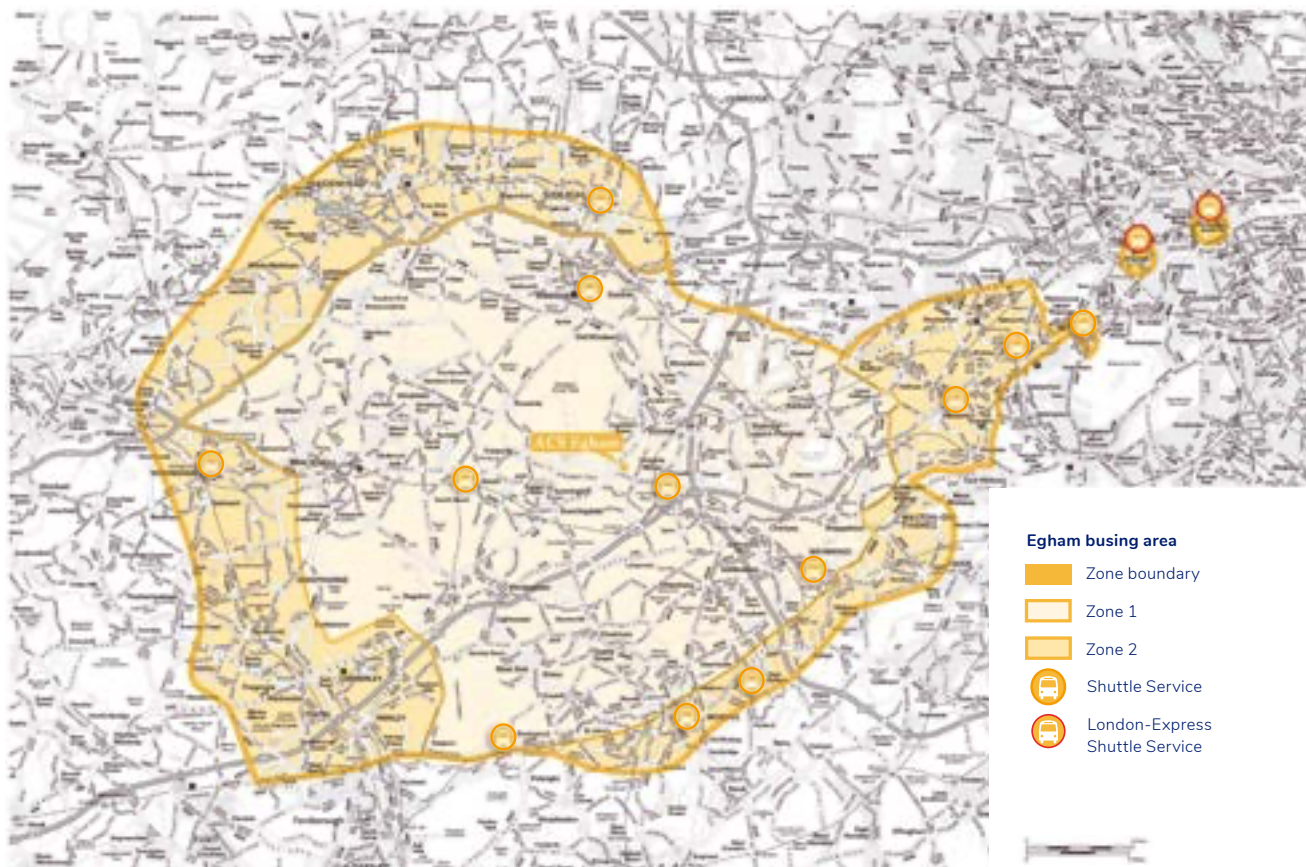
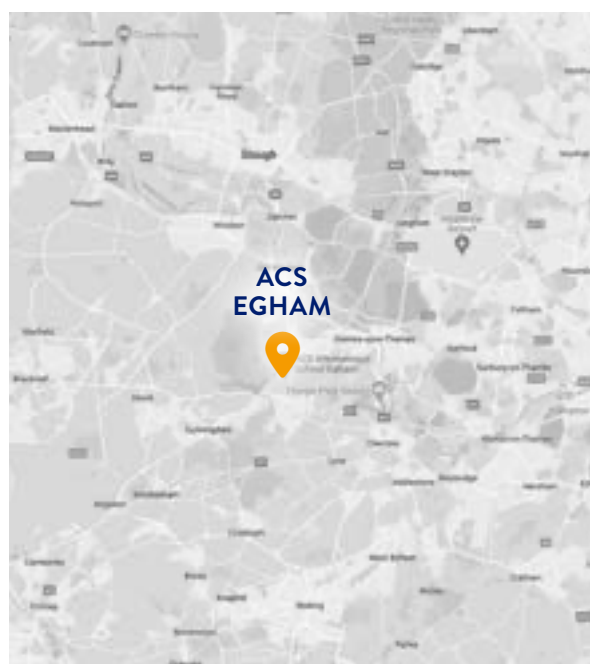
LOCAL BUSES

Because we understand the many challenges facing both local and relocating families, the ACS Egham Transportation Department will make every effort to arrange busing for your children from their first day of school. ACS Egham operates two types of service (door-to-door and shuttle), across two busing zones, with fees set according to distance from school. Zonal areas are indicated on the map.
