

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

At ACS Egham Upper School, students follow the rigorous International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IBMYP) in grades 6-10 before choosing between the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) or the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP) in grades 11-12. This education framework is designed to develop durable skills, providing a seamless, globally recognised route to success – both in and out of the classroom.

To thrive in today's rapidly evolving world, shaped by advancing technologies, social changes, and global challenges, students need more than just academic knowledge. At ACS Egham, we focus on cultivating future-ready skills like creativity, communication, critical thinking, collaboration, and self-direction.

We foster a supportive environment where every student is encouraged to reach their full potential, excel in their chosen paths, and develop into adaptable, resilient individuals. Through a broad and balanced IB curriculum, authentic real-world learning experiences, and a digitally enriched approach, our

students gain the skills, knowledge, and confidence to lead, innovate, and make a meaningful difference both in their careers and communities.

The IB advantage

We have worked hard to become the only school in England fully authorised to offer all IB programmes:

- IB Primary Years Programme (IBPYP) ages 4 to 11
- IB Middle Years Programme (IBMYP) ages 11 to 16
- IB Career-related Programme (IBCP) ages 16 to 18
- IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) ages 16 to 18

A unique element of the IB programmes is that students can join at any age and from different curricula. The strength of the IB continuum lies in its careful balance of challenge and support, enabling a smooth transition and consistent progression. This thoughtfully designed academic and emotional journey gives students a significant advantage over their peers in other systems, often leading them to gain places at some of the highest-ranked universities in the UK and around the world.



THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (IBMYP), AGES 11-16

At the heart of our approach is a commitment to preparing our students for whatever comes next, inspiring them to become effective, confident, and caring individuals ready to succeed on the global stage. We achieve this by balancing the opportunities we offer outside of the classroom with the renowned International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IBMYP).

The IBMYP is founded on three strong principles: holistic learning, communication, and intercultural awareness. It is underpinned by the IB Learner Profile, where students strive to be inquirers, openminded, knowledgeable, caring, thinkers, risk-takers, communicators, balanced, principled, and reflective.

Students study subjects in eight subject areas:

Language and Literature (English), Language Acquisition (French or Spanish), Mathematics, Sciences (incorporating all scientific disciplines), Individuals and Societies (incorporating History, Geography, and Economics), Arts (Drama, Music, and Visual Art), Design (Product Design and Digital Design), and Physical and Health Education.

In addition:

- Service as Action is an integral part of the programme and students complete an Advisory Service Project each year, as well as participating in service activities on an individual basis.
- Students in Grade 10 (aged 15) also complete a Personal Project in their final year of the IBMYP. This in-depth and independent research project enables them to actively showcase the skills and knowledge they have developed throughout the programme.



The IBMYP is designed to be the best preparation to meet the academic rigour of the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) and the IB Career-related Programme (IBCP).

Equivalent to GCSEs and iGCSEs


Importantly, our age 16 students are registered for IBMYP eAssessments. All eAssessment subjects are accredited by Ofqual and are registered as UK Level 1 and Level 2 qualifications, making them equivalent to GCSEs and iGCSEs. Completion of eAssessment provides students with formal, internationally recognised certificates of externally validated results that are valuable for university applications.

The MYP's innovative and award-winning eAssessments are the meaningful culmination of a concept-based learning experience. They rigorously and creatively push students well beyond the rote memorisation of subject-specific content, with a focus on inquiry, communication and critical thinking skills.

IB Pathways for Students aged 16 to 18

Students in Grade 11 and 12 benefit from rigorous academic qualifications which are highly regarded by world-renowned universities. Whichever pathway our students choose, they will benefit from the guidance of our expert teaching staff, university and personal counsellors to prepare them for their next step.





THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME (IBDP), AGES 16 TO 18

The IBDP is an academically challenging programme that ensures students aged 16 to 18 are ready for success at university and beyond.

The programme is:

- Broad and flexible, requiring six subjects which can be configured to differentiate and maximise each student's strengths.
- A programme that encourages university-level skills, and the development of skills outside of the classroom.
- Proven to be grade inflation free, making it a reliable benchmark of attainment.
- A very popular entry qualification with UK, US, and other overseas universities, with many lowering entry requirements for IB students in recognition of its rigour.
- More likely to get students into a Russell Group university, where they are more likely to earn a first-class degree.*

Course requirements

- Subject Groups students take six subjects, three at Higher, and three at Standard Level. They must take maths, science, studies in language and literature, language acquisition, individuals and societies, and an optional arts or another from Group 3 or 4.
- The Core contains three elements: Theory of Knowledge explores the foundations of knowledge and introduces students to university level thinking; the Extended Essay is 4,000 words of self-directed research; and Creativity, Action and Service requires fixed hours engaged in artistic, sporting and/or voluntary work.

The IBDP champions group work, discussions, presentations and developing skills required at university and employment.

THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE CAREER-RELATED PROGRAMME (IBCP), AGES 16 TO 18

The IBCP incorporates the vision and educational principles of the IB into a stand-out programme specifically developed for students who want greater career-related learning. Importantly, the IBCP prepares students for an ever-changing world of work, asking them to consider new perspectives, engage in learning that makes a positive difference, develop both academic and practical skills, think creatively and critically, communicate effectively, work independently and in collaboration, and become self-confident, resilient, and flexible.

The programme is:

- A high-quality programme of international education that helps your child develop skills outside of the classroom, combining academic rigour with practical study.
- Designed to provide more options for the future, including access to further education, apprenticeships, and employment in fields such as business, IT, healthcare, sports, and more.
- Focused on increasing understanding of the wider world and fostering confident, independent learners with an international mindset.

- Built to develop essential life skills such as time management, critical thinking, communication, and personal development to support success in the working world.
- Flexible, allowing students to combine academic subjects with their personal interests and skills.


Course requirements

The IBCP consists of three core components:

Career-related study: Students follow a vocational course or qualification that aligns with their career interests. At ACS Egham, the career-related study offered is the BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Business, Enterprise, and Entrepreneurship, which carries the UCAS equivalence of two IBDP Higher Level subjects.

IB Diploma Programme courses: Students take a minimum of two IB Diploma subjects.

Personal and Professional Skills (PPS): This core component helps develop skills needed for the workplace, such as communication, teamwork, collaboration, ethics, and problem-solving.



HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Eligible ACS Egham students graduate with a High School Diploma, accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). Whether they pursue the IBDP or the IBCP, students also meet the requirements for the High School Diploma, ensuring they are well-prepared for higher education.

As a result, most graduates leave with multiple qualifications that strengthen their university applications. The accredited High School Diploma offers a rigorous, well-rounded academic experience and most North American universities and institutes around the world (often with additional requirements), supporting student success at university and beyond.

TALK EDUCATION



At ACS Egham, our mission is to provide high-quality, values-driven sporting and recreational experiences that promote healthy, active lifestyles and a lifelong passion for sport. We focus on holistic, transformational growth – developing not only athletic performance but also character and values. Students can take part in both competitive and recreational teams, with core sports including volleyball, football, and basketball, alongside seasonal offerings such as cross-country, track and field, badminton, tennis, and golf.

Our after-school Home Language Enrichment (HLE) programme helps students maintain and develop their home languages and cultures while living away from them. Small group classes are led by teachers or parents who are fluent native speakers.

These sessions are fun and engaging, encouraging a love of language and real-life experience with being multilingual. HLE supports language skills, strengthens cultural identity, builds community, and fosters international understanding for today's global families.


COMMUNITY

STUDENT SERVICES

Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

ACS Egham welcomes students with Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND), providing support both in inclusive classrooms and specialist teaching environments to ensure equitable access to the curriculum. Personalised learning accommodations and tailored assessment arrangements help students progress academically while building their skills as lifelong learners. We serve students with mild to moderate learning needs across all grade levels, based on admission requirements and available spaces. However, we are unable to support students with severe behavioural, emotional, or learning difficulties.

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

We believe that achieving proficiency in academic English is not just about overcoming a challenge; it's about recognising and celebrating the advantages of being multilingual.

Our English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme supports students in developing the fluency and confidence they need to thrive in a global community and succeed in rigorous international academic programmes, including the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

Focused learning opportunities help strengthen English skills, vocabulary, and grammatical accuracy while keeping students connected to the wider curriculum. These activities are integrated with classroom learning so that language development takes place in context and supports overall academic progress, and led by Student Services specialist teachers.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Admissions

ACS Egham operates a rolling admissions process, allowing students to join at any grade and any time during the academic year, subject to availability and acceptance. We take a holistic approach to applications, reviewing previous school records, current teacher references, student questionnaires, parent questionnaires and standardised test scores. Additional documents, such as educational psychologist reports or English as an Additional Language (EAL) assessment, are required when relevant.

Once accepted, a refundable enrolment deposit is required to reserve a place. For more details on the admissions process, please contact the Admissions team

Bursaries

As part of the ACS Schools charity, the school offers means-tested bursaries ranging from 10% to 100% of full fees to support families financially. Awards are based on each student's circumstances and look for qualities such as curiosity, an international outlook, and a desire to contribute positively to the community.

Bursaries are available for students entering the school at Grade 6, Grade 8 or Grade 11. Applicants must be UK residents with the legal right to remain at the time of application and live within the school's bus catchment area. Decisions are made in March before the academic year of entry.

Catering

Our award-winning catering department is operated in-house, enabling us to employ and train all our own chefs. We take great pride in producing delicious, fresh and nutritious food that appeals to our international community. Our menus, independently reviewed by registered dieticians, are always seasonal and follow the School Food Trust's nutritional guidelines. We source all our fresh ingredients from approved suppliers. Most of our daily deliveries of vegetables, fruit, dairy and meat come from local producers, so we can trace each meal from farm to fork.

As well as the food on offer at school, students can bring their own lunch from home, adding further flexibility and choice.

ACS Egham students do not wear a school uniform. A school sports kit is available and required for physical education and school sporting activities. Students are expected to dress respectfully and responsibly to maintain an appropriate learning environment.

Busing

We offer a comprehensive busing service with door-to-door and shuttle options, ensuring safe and efficient transportation for students. 
