


OUR CURRICULUM

The broad and flexible curriculum at ACS Hillingdon is designed to help students excel, ensuring they're ready for the next stage of their academic career. Underpinned by the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme, Advanced Placement courses, AP Capstone Diploma and the US High School Diploma, our curriculum emphasises life skills as much as academic excellence, with a focus on experiential learning and leadership that ensures we nurture confident, caring, well-rounded individuals.

CO-CURRICULAR

We have over 40 clubs, 60 sports teams and a wealth of facilities. These include 14-acres of sports fields within easy reach of the main school, something almost unheard of this close to central London. Together these encourage our young people to try new things, building skills and resilience that will benefit them inside and outside the classroom and prepare them for the future.

LOWER SCHOL

AGES 4-10 / PRE-KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 4

During these early years, we establish positive teacher-student relationships so we can provide the individual attention and tailored teaching programme that enables our students to fulfil their potential. We focus on developing each student's confidence, nurturing their strengths and supporting them as they grow, reflecting our deeply held belief that children enter school as natural explorers, engineers, investigators and designers.

We believe in encouraging and enhancing these qualities, celebrating each child's imagination and enthusiasm, planting the seeds of learning within them that will grow and develop over a lifetime so they are ready for anything. To achieve this, our experienced educators cultivate curiosity, critical thinking, teamwork and self-confidence. Equipping our young students with the tools they need to take part in a huge range of exciting activities including Forest School classes, musical performances, field trips, extracurricular activities and community service.











UPPER SCHOOL

AGES 10-18 / GRADES 5-12

Students in Grades 5 and 6 take a broad range of subjects including coding, media and design, social studies and language acquisition. They also follow a project-based learning class, which includes service learning and entrepreneurial skills. The classes end the year with a showcase of their project work, which takes the form of an exhibition for parents and students to attend.

In addition to their core subjects and electives, students in Grades 7 to 10 follow the newly implemented Personal Development Programme. In these classes students focus on developing skills in communication, research, self-management, thinking and social skills. These skills compliment the academic focus in other lessons and enable us to educate the whole-child.

Students in Grades 11 and 12 can select from a wide range of pathways that can be tailored to their individual strengths and aspirations. Our aim is to create students fully confident in their abilities and with a voracious appetite for learning. We deliver this through the breadth of our teaching programme, which incorporates the International Baccalaureate Diploma and Career-related Programmes, Advanced Placement courses and US High School Diploma. Students in Grades 9 to 12 also follow the Global Citizens Diploma (GCD), a unique qualification that goes beyond academic results to acknowledge all of the exceptional citizenship and service-related activities students undertake to become global citizens. The GCD comprises 16 key elements, which are split into core values, competencies and areas of expertise, and include elements such as: community engagement, global understanding, intercultural communication, wilderness engagement, work experience, artistic expression and leadership.

Our experienced, committed Upper School team inspire young minds to set and exceed their own goals. By using the latest technology, building an appreciation of cultural diversity and encouraging students to get involved in local and international community projects, we ensure they leave us as globally-minded, digitally adept citizens, ready to take their place in a rapidly evolving world.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

We offer a robust curriculum, built upon international standards, and adapted to the needs of our diverse student body.

The IB Diploma is the world's most recognised academic programme for students 16–18. It offers a rigorous curriculum requiring six subjects which can be selected according to a student's strengths and interests and provides students with an excellent foundation for university.

In ACS's University Admissions Officers' research conducted over the last ten years, the IB and AP programmes have been shown to significantly outperform A-Levels in developing qualities such as a global outlook, open-mindedness, self-management, coping under pressure and analytical thinking.

SPORTS AT ACS

Sport is an essential part of an all-round education. Developing teamwork, dedication, self-confidence and discipline, so our students are ready for the wider world. It's also great fun, which is why so many of our students take part in after-school sports at some point during the academic year, with many participating in a different team each season.

To support this philosophy, our 11 full-time coaches and students have an array of facilities at their disposal, including a full-size, multi-functional gym, all-weather tennis courts and – the jewel in our crown – 14 acres of football pitches, rugby fields, softball and baseball diamonds, just a short ride from our campus. We also have priority access to a 50-metre Olympic-size swimming pool and athletics track in the local area.

In a typical school year, we field 56 different teams at all levels. Our young athletes compete against local and international schools across Europe, with past fixtures taking place in Paris, Brussels, Frankfurt, Vienna and Athens – providing international level competition and an enriched sporting event experience for students.

VISUAL ARTS

At Hillingdon the arts are a vital part of school life, so we make sure our students are exposed to the widest range of participation opportunities.

Studying the visual arts not only develops cultural understanding and visual literacy, it also enriches the way our students engage with the world around them. It improves concentration, increases writing, speaking and listening skills, enhances group participation and develops dexterity, self-discipline and respect for alternative points of view. Put this together and the visual arts enhance and inspire our entire learning community. READY TO PERFORM.

PERFORMING ARTS

Our high-quality music education programme inspires a life-long love of music while developing self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement. Students of all year groups perform, absorb and evaluate music from a wide range of periods, genres and traditions. They learn to sing, they create music on their own and with others using a variety of instruments, and they have the opportunity to learn a favourite instrument through expert one-to-one tuition. They also learn about the role of technology in music, giving them a keen appreciation of how modern music is created, produced and communicated.

We're proud to say drama is a fundamental part of the student experience at ACS Hillingdon, helping to develop a passion for theatre that lasts a lifetime.

Our co-curricular play and musical productions – often among the highlights of our academic year – together with our participation in drama competitions and festivals, teach students to collaborate, solve problems and explore ideas, transforming how they see the world. Drama also helps our students develop as leaders, fostering excellent communication skills and building confidence – essential qualities that ready them for success in the workplace.

Our drama programme builds on the National Core Arts Standards and is enriched by our membership of the International Schools Theatre Association (ISTA). As part of this, we offer annual trips to attend theatre festivals throughout Europe for Upper School students. Through ISTA, our students work with international theatre practitioners, developing their cultural literacy and appreciation of different perspectives.

We also have a drama programme so students can earn LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) qualifications as part of their practical examinations in communication and performance. As well as developing selfconfidence, performance techniques and language awareness, LAMDA qualifications have the added benefit of enabling students to earn UCAS points that support their university applications.











READY FOR A WORLD THAT DEMANDS ADAPTABILITY AND CURIOSITY.

FILM

We introduce photography and film to children as young as 5 throughout the Lower School technology classes. In Grades 5–8, filmmaking is a significant part of our exciting STEAM curriculum, which includes a "discovery week". In High School, our film study cumulates in the IBDP Film course, part of the IB Diploma and IB Career-related programmes.

Through film, our students learn about the context and setting for some of the most exciting stories in human history, before deconstructing the techniques their creators used to bring them to life on the screen. As part of our film curriculum, students get the chance to work as directors, cinematographers, editors, sound designers and screenwriters, learning professional creative filmmaking techniques through exciting, hands-on projects that are an opportunity for them to tell their own stories.


STEAM

If you're not familiar with the acronym STEAM, it stands for "Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths", a whole-school interdisciplinary approach that reflects the growing importance of design and technology in today's world. To bring this important topic to life, we continually invest in the latest equipment, including building our own 3D printers, so our students are ready for the careers of tomorrow. Our facilities, including a well-equipped Science Centre with seven new labs, a "Think Tank" as well as a Coding and Media space, mean Hillingdon students have creative areas to bring their ideas to life.

In Lower School we offer a Coding, Media and Design programme which provides students with the skills necessary to problem solve, to learn when things don't go according to plan as well as investigate, explore, create and reflect in the physical and online worlds. They will also use age appropriate apps and programmes to support learning across all curriculum areas including computer science. Digital resilience and citizenship encourages students to demonstrate personal responsibility and ethical behaviours and digital literacy is taught helping students find appropriate, relevant and reliable information. In addition, augmented reality, introductory electronics and robotics are explored.

In Upper School our students continue to develop and hone their skills, covering topics including cinematography, editing, animation principles. They try different design cycles, utilise design criteria and consider the impact on their audiences. Communication, planning, budgeting and making connections continue to be key 'life skills' that they will practice alongside extending key concepts in media creation, design and coding.

In Grades 11 and 12 students can choose to follow the IBCP in Digital Arts programme which includes computer science, coding, animation, visual effects and game design.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

We have a wide programme of co-curricular activities, underscoring our belief that learning doesn't stop when lessons end. As well our service and volunteering programme, we offer sports, drama productions, musical groups and design and technology. All of which are available to students throughout the school week.

With over 40 clubs and 60 sports teams at ACS Hillingdon, there's something for every student at every age. Several of our clubs are organised and run by the students themselves, helping to develop their leadership skills. One of these is our Model United Nations club where we debate topics of international concern. As part of this students can attend conferences each year in The Hague, where they take part in debating the world's most pressing issues with thousands of other students. It is all part of our commitment to educating the whole student so they're ready for tomorrow.

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
















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
