These rigorous academic pathways allow students to tailor their studies to their interests while being both challenged and supported throughout their journey.

To thrive in a rapidly evolving world shaped by new technologies, global challenges and shifting perspectives, students need more than academic knowledge. At Hillingdon, we foster future-ready skills such as creativity, communication, critical thinking, collaboration and self-direction. Our curriculum is enriched by co-curricular and real-world learning opportunities that encourage students to engage deeply and think independently.

UPPER SCHOOL PROGRAMMES

Academic Programme Grades 5-8 (ages 10-14)

Throughout these Grades, we follow a flexible, inquiry-based curriculum grounded in internationally recognised standards. Core subjects include Language & Literature, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Visual and Performing Arts, Health and Physical Education, Coding, Media and Design, and Language Acquisition (French or Spanish). Students also participate in our Inspire & Challenge initiative, which offers a variety of enriching and distinctive activities, such as Crime, Media & Critical Inquiry, Maths Challenge, Creative Writing and Science Investigation. These opportunities may vary each year and are designed to encourage curiosity and independent thinking – while developing global awareness and intercultural understanding.

A diverse array of co-curricular activities in the arts, sports, and clubs enriches students' academic and personal growth. Within our caring and supportive environment, every student is inspired to achieve their full potential, building a strong foundation for future success in the final years of school.

Academic Programme Grades 9-10 (ages 15-16)

Building on the strong foundation laid in Grades 5–8, our Grades 9–10 programme offers a rigorous yet flexible curriculum tailored to the diverse needs of our students. These years promote greater student agency and independence, encouraging learners to take ownership of their academic journey while earning credits towards their High School Diploma. Core subjects include Language & Literature, Mathematics, Sciences (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Introduction to Computer Science), Social Studies,

and Language Acquisition (French, Spanish, Japanese A).

Students also choose from a range of electives such as art & design, drama, music, global issues, and digital art & textiles alongside our Inspire and Challenge programme.

Beyond academics, students are encouraged to participate in a variety of co-curricular opportunities, including leadership roles, overseas trips, and student-led initiatives. This balanced approach supports both academic excellence and personal growth, empowering our students to become confident, well-rounded individuals prepared for the challenges of Grades 11–12 and beyond.

In Grades 5-10, we monitor progress through a combination of school-based formative and summative school-based assessments alongside external examinations within AP subjects. We offer meaningful assessment that nurtures students' love of learning and prepares them for the school-leaving qualifications they will undertake in Grades 11 and 12.

Academic Qualifications Grades 11-12 (ages 16-18)

Our Grade 11 and 12 students benefit from rigorous academic qualifications which are highly regarded by world-renowned universities. Whichever pathway our students choose they will benefit from the guidance of our expert teaching staff, university and academic counsellors in order to prepare them for their next step.

ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

The IBDP is an academically challenging programme that ensures students aged 16 to 18 are ready for success at university and beyond.

The programme is:

- Broad and flexible, requiring six subjects which can be configured to differentiate and maximise each student's strengths
- A programme that encourages university-level

- skills, and the development of skills outside of the classroom
- Proven to be grade inflation free, making it a reliable benchmark of attainment
- A very popular entry qualification with UK, US, and other overseas universities, with many lowering entry requirements for IB students in recognition of its rigour
- More likely to get students into a Russell Group university, where they are more likely to earn a first-class degree*

Course requirements

- Subject Groups Students take six subjects, with three at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL). They must choose one subject from each of the following groups: mathematics, sciences, studies in language and literature, language acquisition, and individuals and societies. For their sixth subject, they can either choose a subject from the arts or a second subject from either the the sciences of individuals and societies.
- The Core Contains three elements: Theory of Knowledge explores the foundations of knowledge and introduces students to university-level thinking; the Extended Essay is 4,000 words of self-directed research; and Creativity, Action and Service requires fixed hours engaged in artistic, sporting and/or voluntary work.

The IBDP champions group work, discussions, presentations and developing skills required at university and employment. For more information, visit www.ibo.org.



The International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP) Ages 16-18

The IBCP incorporates the vision and educational principles of the IB into a stand-out programme specifically developed for students who want greater career-related learning. Importantly, the IBCP prepares students for an ever-changing world of work, asking them to consider new perspectives, engage in learning that makes a positive difference, develop both academic and practical skills, think creatively and critically, communicate effectively, work independently and in collaboration, and become self-confident, resilient, and flexible.

As a group of schools, we have been teaching the IB for over fifty years, including a comprehensive suite of IB Art options encompassing visual, performing arts, and film. Our expertise in these areas has enabled us to pioneer the adoption of the IBCP, offering a unique programme in Theatre Arts and Digital Arts (games design, animation, and visual effects).

The programme is:

- A high-quality programme of international education that helps your child develop skills outside of the classroom, combining academic rigour with practical study
- Designed to provide more options for the future, including access to further education, apprenticeships, and employment in fields such as business, game design, theatre, film, and more
- Focused on increasing understanding of the wider world and fostering confident, independent learners with an international mindset
- Built to develop essential life skills such as time management, critical thinking, communication, and personal development to support success in the working world
- Flexible, allowing students to combine academic subjects with their personal interests and skills

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Course requirements

The IBCP consists of three core components:

- Career-related study: Students follow a course or qualification that aligns with their career interests. At ACS Hillingdon, the career-related study offered is in Theatre Arts or Digital Arts (game design, animation and VFX).
- **IB Diploma Programme courses:** Students take a minimum of two IB Diploma subjects.
- Personal and Professional Skills (PPS): This
 core component helps develop skills needed
 for the workplace, such as communication,
 teamwork, collaboration, ethics, and problemsolving.





COLLEGE BOARD ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are an internationally recognised academic qualification covering a range of disciplines including: Arts, English, Social Studies, Mathematics and Computer Science.

AP courses are:

 Academically rigorous, offering challenging coursework that mirrors university and college classes, while helping students build essential time management and study skills.

- Content-rich, laying strong foundations for future study across a range of disciplines and allowing students to specialise in subjects they enjoy.
- Fast-paced and stimulating, with a level of depth and challenge comparable to A-levels and the IB, despite being shorter in duration.
- Excellent preparation for university, fostering independence, critical thinking, and adaptability in dynamic academic environments.
- Globally recognised, opening pathways to top universities in the US, Canada, the UK, and beyond.

ACS GLOBAL PROGRAMME

At ACS Hillingdon, we recognise that every student is different – each with their individual strengths, passions, and goals. That's why we offer the ACS Global Programme: a flexible and personalised pathway for students in Grades 11 and 12 who seek an internationally recognised education. This option empowers students to design a customised

academic journey by combining courses from our existing offerings – including IB Diploma subjects, IB Career-related subjects, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, and High School classes – tailored to their aspirations. With this personalised approach, each student can pursue a "best-fit" pathway that truly reflects who they are and where they're headed.

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Eligible ACS Hillingdon students graduate with a High School Diploma, accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). Whether they pursue the IBDP, IBCP or ACS Global Programme, all students also meet the requirements for the High School Diploma, ensuring they are well-prepared for higher education.

As a result, most graduates leave with multiple qualifications that strengthen their university applications. The accredited Diploma offers a rigorous, well-rounded academic experience and serves as a recognised entrance qualification for most North American universities and institutes around the world (often with additional requirements), supporting student success at university and beyond.

The perfect complement to our rigorous academic curriculum is an equal focus on co-curricular activities and opportunities.

Sport

We are a full member of the London Schools Sports Association (LSSA), which organises weekly fixtures and end-of-season tournaments. We are also part of an international league for varsity teams, providing a pathway to success in the International Schools Athletics Association (ISAA). Our students compete in events across the Netherlands, Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Belgium, Spain, and Greece.

As a comparatively small school, we take pride in consistently fielding competitive and successful teams. Each sports season concludes with an awards ceremony, followed by a banquet at the end of the school year. Bi-Annual "Hawks Night" Events energise our school community, uniting students, staff, and parents as we rally around our athletes. School appreciation events like these are proven to strengthen morale, build unity, and enhance belonging.

To support our most gifted and talented athletes, we offer the Elite Performance Pathway (EPP), a holistic programme designed to develop both the person and the athlete, helping students become strong university scholarship candidates and progress to higher-level sport beyond school.

We offer an impressive range of sports, including football, volleyball, cross country, dance, basketball, rugby, swimming, tennis, track and field, and golf.

Performing Arts

Performing Arts at ACS Hillingdon Upper School is a vibrant and integral part of student life, offering numerous opportunities for creative expression through theatre, music, and film. Students participate in a wide range of high-quality productions such as Chicago, Grease, Romeo & Juliet, and Shrek, and engage in international experiences through ISTA festivals across Europe. Music is equally celebrated with after-school rock bands, jazz ensembles, and choirs. The school's IBCP film programme allows students to explore global cinematic influences and develop technical skills using industry-standard equipment. Through a unique partnership with Pinewood Studios, IBCP students gain hands-on experience in areas such as makeup and prosthetics, deepening their understanding of the film industry while exploring real-world themes like body image and environmental impact in media.

Students can also take private music lessons once a week on campus for various instruments such as viola, cello, flute, and clarinet, based on availability, at an additional cost and scheduled during regular classes on a rotating basis.

The Global Citizen Diploma (GCD)


The GCD is an additional credential earned alongside academic studies, designed to help students develop global awareness, ethical responsibility,

Home Language Enrichment

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

We believe that achieving proficiency in academic English is not just about overcoming a challenge, it's about recognising and celebrating the advantages of being multilingual.

Our English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme supports students in Grades 5-10 in developing the fluency and confidence they need to thrive in a global community and succeed in rigorous international academic programmes, including the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), the International Baccalaureate Careerrelated Programme (IBCP), and the ACS Global Programme.

Focused, small-group lessons are designed to rapidly build foundational English skills, vocabulary, and grammatical accuracy. Depending on their level of English, students are initially assigned up to three lessons per day. These sessions are led by EAL specialist teachers and are based on subject content to ensure students remain connected to the wider curriculum as their language skills develop.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Admissions

We operate a rolling admissions process that enables students to join us in any grade and at any time of the academic year, subject to availability and acceptance.

Our online application process takes a holistic approach, assessing each candidate individually by reviewing previous school records, references, parent and student questionnaires answers and standardised test scores. We also ask for additional information such as educational psychologist reports or English as an additional language (EAL) tests, where relevant.

A refundable enrolment deposit is payable after a student has been accepted in order to reserve a place. For more details of the application process, please contact our Admissions team.

Bursaries

ACS Schools is a registered charity with the mission of advancing education for all. As part of our philanthropic goals, we offer financially assisted programmes in the form of bursaries. These financial awards range up to 100% of our full fees. All bursaries are means-tested, with each award dependent on the student's individual circumstances. In line with our values, we look for students with enquiring minds, an international perspective and a strong desire to make a difference.

We offer Upper School bursaries for students aged, 11, 13 or 16 (Grades 6, 8 and 11).. Students applying for the IBDP in Grade 11 should display the ability to benefit from an academically rigorous programme.

We welcome applications from parents who believe their child will benefit from our international curriculum and who will make a real contribution to life at ACS Hillingdon. We ask that candidate pupils are resident in the UK and have the right to remain (subject to complying with full immigration laws and regulations). Following an application, we assess the student information and financial data provided and decide in March, prior to the academic year of entry.

Catering

Our award-winning catering department is operated in-house, enabling us to employ and train all our own chefs. Most of our daily deliveries of vegetables, fruit, dairy and meat come from local producers, so we can trace each meal from farm to fork.

Uniform

ACS students do not wear school uniforms. A school sports kit is available and required for physical education and school sporting activities from Grade 5 upwards. Students are expected to dress respectfully and responsibly to maintain an appropriate learning environment.

Busing

We offer a comprehensive busing service with door-to-door and shuttle options, ensuring safe and efficient transportation for students. Our Transport Coordinator works to arrange busing from your child's first day (subject to availability). To help us organise this, please provide your home address as soon as possible.

Our door-to-door bus service is available from Pre-Kindergarten upwards, and the shuttle service and late bus service are available from Grade 1 onwards. Shuttle service stops are assigned each year according to the home locations of our families. Example stops include Beaconsfield, Chiswick, Ealing, Hammersmith, Hillingdon, Ickenham, Kensington, Kew Bridge Station, Marylebone, Northwood, Notting Hill, Pinner, Richmond Station, Ruislip, and West Ruislip (subject to availability and changes yearly).


